160 nations have modeled their constitution after ours. The concept of three branches of government corresponds to the three roles of God found in Isaiah 33:22. The founding fathers drew their inspiration for our new nation from their deep faith in God.

"Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof; or abridging the freedom of speech, or of the press; or of the right of the people peaceably to assemble." 1st Amendment of the Bill of Rights.

Many nations do not allow for freedom of worship or speech.

In John 8 Jesus is teaching in the Temple at the Feast of Tabernacles also called the Feast of Booths. The Jews built temporary shelters called "sukkot" to remind them of their journeys in the wilderness. They emerged from Egypt as a free nation headed for the Promised Land. They remembered that God is the One who gave them their freedom and eventually their land.

Every July 4th we should, like the Jews, take time not just to thank God for our hotdogs and hamburgers, but also for God's gifts of freedom.

We are free to choose where to live; what job to have; who to marry. We are free to worship God according to the Bible. We are free to share our faith and pray in public.

1. For the Founding Fathers was _____

Loss of Property, loss of Freedom, and even loss of Life.

What happened to the 56 men who signed the Declaration of Independence? Five signers were captured by the British as traitors and tortured before they died. 12 had their homes ransacked and burned. 2 lost their sons fighting in the army, and another had two sons captured. 9 of the 56 fought and died from wounds or hardships in the War for Independence. When they signed this document, they pledged their lives, their fortunes, and their sacred honor.

2. For the Soldiers and Sailors was and is

Loss of limb, loss of a normal life, and loss of life. Many veterans are plagued with PTSD, or addiction, or tempted to commit suicide. We need to support them.

360,000 Union soldiers died to save the Union and free the slaves. With the stroke of his pen, President Abraham Lincoln signed the Emancipation Proclamation and abolished slavery from our nation.

3) World War 2

In all of history, the largest number of casualties from a war that ever

occurred was during World War 2 (70-85 million).

The service and sacrifice of our Armed Forces is the reason that we are free today. This is the reason that people risk their lives to come here. The snapshot of WW2 is the Flag at ______.

In 1945, U.S. Marines fought one of the bloodiest battles in American history on a small volcanic island called Iwo Jima in the Pacific. Japanese soldiers were deeply entrenched in tunnels. The battle lasted 36 days, and nearly 7,000 American Marines died - 20,000 wounded.

The Marines at Iwo Jima remind us that every inch of freedom we enjoy was purchased with courage, blood, and sacrifice. Just as those men gave everything for our freedom, so Jesus Christ gave everything for our eternal freedom.

Yes, freedom is a precious gift... but it only lasts a lifetime. Jesus Christ, the Son of God, said that you have an eternal soul that will live somewhere forever - in heaven or hell.

In John 8 Jesus said, "the truth shall make you free." Jesus told us the truth.
